WELCOME TO MANIFESTA 11 IN ZÜRICH 2016

From 11 June to 18 September 2016, Zurich is hosting Manifesta 11. Under the title *What People Do for Money: Some Joint Ventures*, the European biennial of contemporary art will be present throughout the entire city. Manifesta 11 includes exhibitions in the Löwenbräukunst, Helmhaus and in 30 satellites, as well as the floating Pavillon of Reflections at Bellevue, the Cabaret der Künstler – Zunfthaus Voltaire in Niederdorf and the many Parallel Events taking place throughout the city. EXHIBITION VENUES

Löwenbräukunst, Helmhaus, Pavillon of Reflection and Cabaret der Künstler – Zunfthaus Voltaire are the main exhibition venues at Manifesta 11. LÖWENBRÄUKUNST

Where beer used to be brewed is now home to one of Zurich's most renowned contemporary art institutions. For Manifesta 11, most of the new productions and *The Historical Exhibition: Sites Under Construction* are on show at the Löwenbräukunst.

HELMHAUS

The Helmhaus in Zurich has invited Manifesta 11 curator Christian Jankowski to be guest curator and is playing its part in the art biennial by showing new productions and hosting part of the *The Historical Exhibition: Sites Under Construction*.

Opening hours: Monday through Sunday 11.00am to 8.00pm, Thursdays 11.00am to 10.00pm.

SATELLITES

Manifesta 11 is all about professional life in Zurich. Thirty international artists have joined forces with local Zurich professionals (acting as hosts) to create new artworks. Parts of the exhibition will be shown at the hosts' place of work, known as the satellites. They are spread out all over the city and are well worth a visit. PAVILLON OF REFLECTIONS

The architectural icon of Manifesta 11 is a floating platform on Lake Zurich near Bellevue. During the day, it will operate as a public swimming pool (8:00am to 7:00pm; admission for pool only CHF 6) with a bar/café (8:00 to 24:00pm). In the evening, it will turn into a cinema with documentaries about the making of the Manifesta 11 artworks, discussions and other special events (8:00pm to 11:30pm). For holders of a valid ticket to Manifesta 11, admission to both the pool and cinema are free of charge. Tickets for Manifesta 11 will also be on sale on the Pavillon. CABARET DER KÜNSTLER – ZUNFTHAUS VOLTAIRE

Manifesta 11 has founded a new guild in Zurich, the Guild of Artists*. It will be based in the Cabaret Voltaire in the Zurich district of Niederdorf, which will be converted into a guild house and renamed Cabaret der Künstler – Zunfthaus Voltaire. The studio of guild master Manuel Scheiwiller along with the café and shop are open to the public, while the guild hall is reserved for members only. To become a member you must perform on the stage of the guild hall. From Wednesday through Saturday, starting at 8pm the joint venture performances will take place, featuring an artist and a non-artist. In addition to the scheduled performances, everyone will also have the chance to apply spontaneously to put on their own performance by submitting a proposal at the guild hall entrance: To find out about opening hours and the performance programme, visit the Manifesta 11 website from June onwards: www.manifesta11.org

PARALLEL EVENTS

Every edition of Manifesta is accompanied by Parallel Events. The idea is to present various aspects of the local and regional art scenes and facilitate an exchange between them and the main exhibition. The Manifesta 11 Parallel Events include 38 projects from the visual arts, as well as performance, video, photography, dance, theatre, music and design. Most of the Parallel Events are free of charge however please check the Parallel Events website before your visit. TICKETS

We offer One-day tickets (CHF 30), Three-day tickets (CHF 50) or a Season pass (CHF 150). Tickets can be purchased at the following locations: Löwenbräukunst, Helmhaus, Cabaret der Künstler – Zunfthaus Voltaire, Pavillon of Reflections. The Carte Blanche features special offers. The One-day and Three-day tickets for Manifesta 11 also include free use of public transport.

TOURS

Bring along your friends, colleagues, classmates, family or neighbours for a guided tour with one of our professionally trained art mediators. Guided tours can be reserved via our website: www.manifesta11.org/ visit and are a great way to discover the biennial.

Furthermore, we offer six open tours every week with our art mediators, which don't need to be booked in advance. Just show up and register from 11:00 am at the Info Points at the main entrances to Helmhaus or Löwenbräukunst. Tours of Löwenbräukunst take place every Monday from 6:00 pm to 7.30 pm and Thursday from 8:00 pm to 9:30 pm, tours of the Helmhaus every Tuesday from 6:00 pm to 7.30 pm and Saturday from 3:00 pm to 4:30 pm. For Manifesta 11 Satellites tours please check the Manifesta 11 website. Free of charge with a valid Manifesta 11 ticket. Max. 20 participants (First come, first served).

TRANSPORTATION

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Zurich has an excellent public transport system (ZVV) with trams, buses, subway trains and boats. The One-day and Three-day tickets for Manifesta 11 also include free use of public transport (Zone 110, 2nd class, not including night surcharges) for the duration of their validity: www.zvv.ch.

Line Nr. 4 directly takes you directly to the main venues Löwenbräukunst (Stop Dammweg) – Helmhaus (Stop Helmhaus) – Cabaret Voltaire (Stop Rathaus) und Pavillon of Reflections (Stop Bellevue).

WALKING DISTANCES

The main exhibition venues of Manifesta 11 are within walking distance of each other.

Pavillon of Reflections to Helmhaus: 10 minutes, Pavillon of Reflections to Cabaret der Künstler – Zunfthaus Voltaire: 10 minutes, Cabaret der Künstler – Zunfthaus Voltaire to Helmhaus: 5 minutes, Helmhaus or Cabaret der Künstler – Zunfthaus Voltaire to Löwenbräukunst: 30 minutes (a long-ish but very pleasant stroll along the banks of the Limmat).
